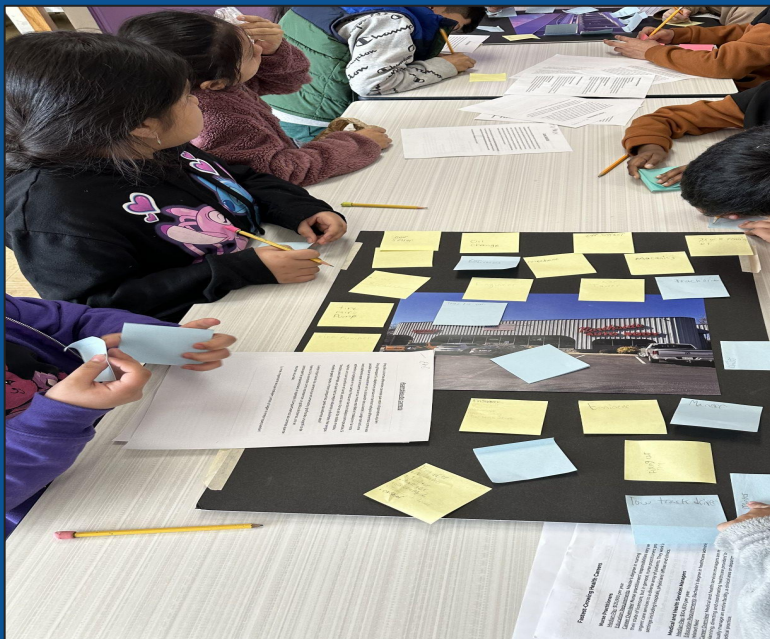

Elementary -Parent/Caregiver- To Know

- Most children don't know of many careers outside of what they are exposed to, such as teacher, doctor, and firefighter.
- Elementary school students are at an ideal age to learn about a variety of careers.
- The more exposure your child has, the more opportunities they have to be inspired and develop skills as they learn more about careers.
- This helps your child see the real world impacts of academic subjects and start to think about the future.
- One way to do this is to talk about the different careers people have who make things your child uses and sees every day.
- For example, you can highlight the variety of different jobs displayed in the end credits of a film.
- You can also look at a household appliance and think about the different people who worked to create it: designers, engineers, manufacturers, product testers, truck drivers, marketing employees, sales employees, even the writer of the instruction manual.
- Engaging in discussions like this with your child helps them develop critical thinking skills while exposing them to a variety of careers they aren't likely to think of without some parental guidance.
