

<u>Kindness Creatures</u>: The week of Nov 15th, at Clinton, Morse, and the ELC the focus was on kindness for International Kindness Week. Students discussed ways to be kind to themselves and others and then practiced being kind with a partner in their class. Students then created their own kindness creature.


