Purpose of Town Hall Meetings

- To continue with the tradition of engaging school and community stakeholders.
- To provide a platform for the ability of school and community stakeholders to hear plans and voice their perspective to help inform what we will do collectively to address the academic, social, emotional, and wellness needs of PCSD students.
 - On August 7, 2020, Governor Cuomo indicated that the determination of how individual districts reopen will be made by local school districts under strict Department of Health guidelines.
- To provide school and community stakeholders an opportunity to seek clarity from district staff.

Four Guiding Principles for Reopening PCSD

- 1 Deliver high-quality instruction to students, regardless of delivery model.
- 2 Ensure the safety and wellness of students and PCSD employees.
- Work with our parents to ensure that their children's' academic, social, emotional and wellness needs are met.
- Optimize the use of school and community resources in supporting PCSD students.

Percentage preferring Distance Learning


Percentage preferring a Hybrid model

Percentage undecided if they will return their child to school






Perceptions on Reopening PCSD



Staff Preferred Instructional Model by Rank






Percentage preferring in person teaching/work

Reopening PCSD Highlights

- Taskforce Committees will continue to meet as long as necessary to strengthen PCSD's impact on delivering against the Guiding Principles and mandates.
- All applicable NYSED and NYDOH mandates will be adhered to throughout every PCSD Reopening Plans.
- Students will be provided with quality instruction no matter the instructional delivery model.
 - Given the unique school footprints and mandates associated with school reopening PCSD will not be able to open school
 in September with 100% of students returning for in person instruction.
 - 57.9% of parents who have responded to the survey indicate that PCSD should deliver instruction remotely in September.
 - 42.5% of parents are unlikely to send their children to school if in-person is the instructional delivery model.
- Students with exceptionalities will be provided with targeted supports under distance learning and hybrid instructional models.
- Proper PPE will be provided to staff and students.
- PCSD will have a strong social emotional and wellbeing component for all students.
- Students nutrition needs will be met no matter the instructional delivery model.
- Parents and the Community will be engaged and empowered throughout the pandemic.
- Facilities will be maintained using CDC, DOH, and NYSED guidance.
- All PCSD vendors and partners will adhere to district protocols.



Reopening PCSD Challenges

- Navigating the unknown of COVID-19's impact on the school community and community.
- Unfunded NYSED and NYDOH mandates.
- Complexity of NYSED and NYDOH mandates.
- Addressing the logistics of school reopening under the NYSED and NYDOH mandates.
- Time required to implement hybrid plan in order to adhere to all NYSED and NYDOH mandates.
- Social distancing restrictions on PCSD yellow school buses.
- Facilities work currently underway.
- Connecting students with meaningful activity outside of the school environment as a supplement for positive youth development.
- Providing every student with a device at the start of the academic year (Smart Schools Bond funding approved yet additional devices will not be delivered to PCSD until October).
- Limiting the flexibility of PCSD parents' employment hours.
- Guaranteeing that all PCSD employees will remain gainfully employed under a distance learning model

Reopening PCSD Activity

- Working to address the issue of educational equity for PCSD students and families.
- Secured 1.6 million dollars to purchase and upgrade technology.
- Ordered additional devices that will close the digital gap for our families (Chromebooks and Hotspots).
- In the process of hiring a certified nurse for every PCSD building.
- Ordered PPE's for student and staff (awaiting delivery).
- Ordered cleaning equipment that will increase the effectiveness of school wide cleaning and increase efficiency.
- Have assessed building ventilation and are progressively working to increase the functionality of the systems' air flow and quality.
- In the process of increasing the number of custodial workers district-wide.
- In the process of posting school case managers who will be responsible for reengaging students who are not participating in the schooling process after the school has exhausted its efforts.
- Hiring three district family advocates to serve as critical connectors to our families (Spanish and English speaking).
- Working with the Reopening PCSD Taskforce to develop plan and strategy to enhance our delivery of instruction, support, and services to PCSD students and parents.
- Working with DCDOH to coordinate Contact Tracing and COVID-19 testing for staff and students.
